

Driving Instructions to Saissac

From Toulouse: Saissac is almost true EAST of Toulouse.

1. The fastest and most direct route is to use the A61 Peage Highway. It will cost you about 4 euros to travel on this route. The Periphque freeway which circles Toulouse will give BLUE directions to Montpellier.
2. Otherwise, we suggest you follow the N113/D6113 until you encounter Alzonne. This is a slower but very picturesque route. (go to 8 below)
3. If you choose to take the A61, travel for approx 70km to Bram and exit and pay.
4. You will now encounter two consecutive roundabouts. Follow the GREEN signs to Carcassonne. This route will take you around the southern outskirts of Bram, and not into the township.
5. You are now on the D33, and you will travel about 10km until you encounter a sign which directs you to Alzonne. You will move slightly to the right, and then turn to the left to cross over the road towards Alzonne. There will be a rural nightclub in front of you.
6. This is a small and windy road, which will take you under the railway line and into the centre of Alzonne. It is only about 2km.
7. Upon arrival in Alzonne, you will encounter traffic lights. Turn right and as you drive out of the town, you are briefly on the D8 which becomes the D 6113.
8. Through Alzonne, follow the D6113 for about 6kms, and you will encounter signs indicating SAISAAC to the left. You will come off the road to the right, and then swing left to cross on the D629. You will see a small stone church to your left. You are now only 10 minutes away.
9. Once on the D629, drive for 3kms and you will encounter a roundabout at Moussoulens. Follow the signs to Montileur, which is about 5km away.
10. You are now starting to climb a little into the Montagne Noir. As you enter Montileur, you will follow the one way narrow streets up through the village and turn left over a narrow stone bridge. Follow the signs to Saissac, only 6 km away.
11. You will first glimpse the Chateau du Saissac to your left, with the village behind it. A few hundreds metres onwards, as you enter the village, you will see two large stone towers to your left, opposite the bar/hotel. One is the Information Centre. This is your cue to slow down and complete a tight 180 degree turn to your left.
12. Just past the Information Centre slightly on your right is a public car park. This sits above and overlooks the house. To the left is a sloping roadway which meets Rue d'Autan. At the bottom of this road, turn right into Rue d'Autan and house is 50 metres along on your left.
13. You can park anywhere in the free area outside the house, or slightly back towards the old washing area to your right. Be ware that other residents do drive through these streets, and you need to ensure they have room to pass. Welcome to Saissac!!
